RE: CORONAVIRUS: COVID-19

Sabine County is closely monitoring the spread of the Novel Coronavirus, now known as COVID-19. Sabine County's top priority is providing a safe environment for Sabine County citizens as well as Sabine County's staff. While there have been no confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Sabine County as of 03/17/2020, we understand there may be health concerns over the recent outbreak of respiratory illness caused by the new coronavirus. Therefore, at this time, Sabine County Courthouse will remain open with modifications. By law, the public must have access to certain open proceedings, such as state mandated court hearings, that occur in the courthouse. That said, each elected official is the sole authority for limiting or modifying the business of their offices. Those offices are:

We remain in contact with the TDSHS and the Texas Department of Emergency Management. These measures are consistent with our ongoing efforts to keep the public and our employees safe and informed.

We appreciate your cooperation as we continue to monitor this situation and determine the best course of action in order to continue to serve the taxpayers of Sabine County.
